Marina facilities

ACI marina Split lies in the southwestern part of the city port, north of the Sustipan Peninsula. The long breakwater protects the marina from the southern winds. Marina has 364 berths and 60 boat places on land. All berths have water and power supply.

Arrival details

by plane

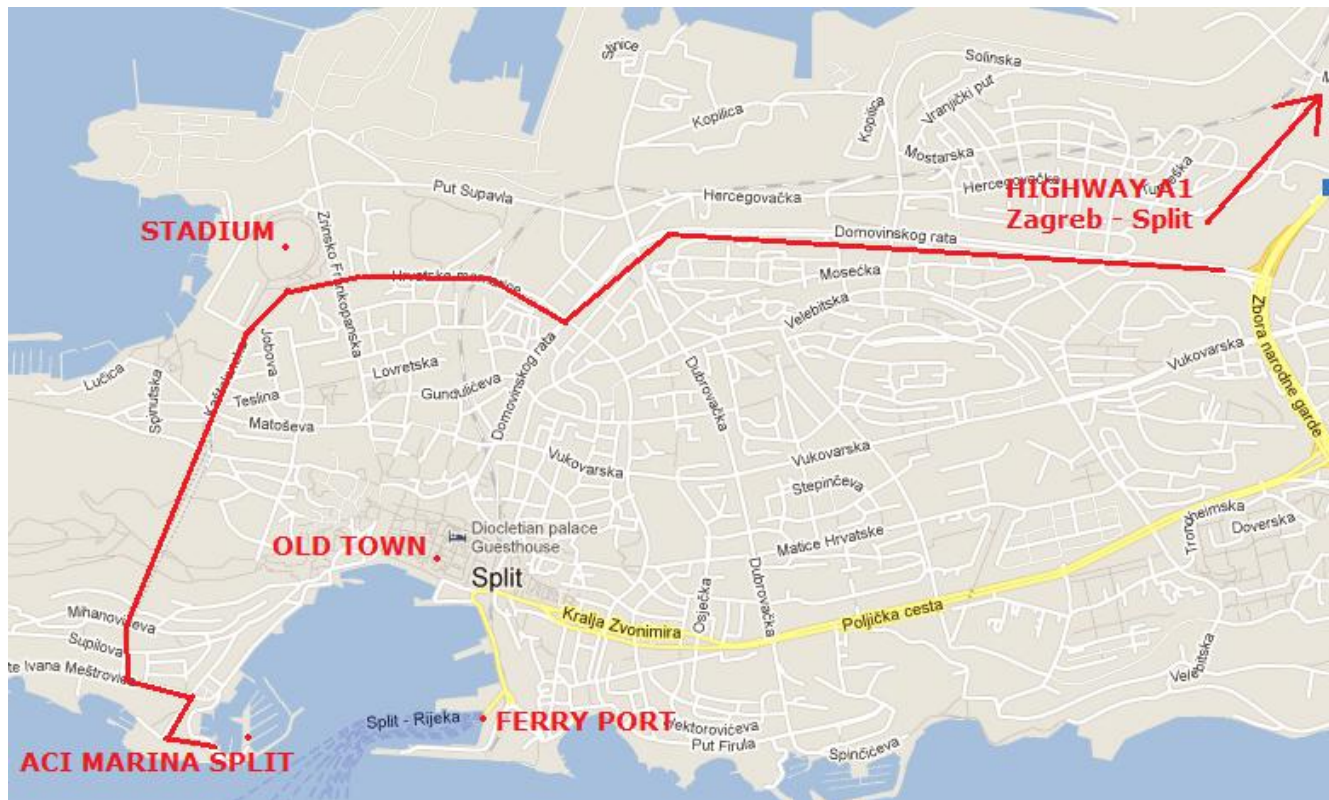
The Split airport is only 23 km away from Ultra charter base in Split. Direct flights to Split depart from the following European cities: Rome, Göteborg, Berlin, Prague, Amsterdam, Frankfurt, Paris, London and Manchester, etc. There are many other possible options if flying to Zagreb. There are several flights from Zagreb to Split and vice versa on a daily basis, and the flight lasts approximately 35 minutes. If you are coming overseas, fly via Frankfurt or Roma directly to Split or through Zagreb.

by boat

If travelling by ship, you can use some of the regular ferry lines from Rijeka or Dubrovnik toward Split, or international ferry or fast lines from Italy (Ancona, Civitanova, Giulianova, Pescara, Bari). Once you are in Split port, you can reach our base in Split by transfer, bus or taxi, or walking (aprox max 20min walking distance).

by car / bus

If you are arriving in Split from the direction of Italy, you can use the Adriatic main road from Rijeka, if you prefer to travel along the coast. The other possibility is to use the highway directly when you reach Rijeka or the junction Zuta Lokva near the town Senj, about 60 km south of Rijeka, and continue driving toward Split. If you are arriving from the direction of north, you can use the old route Zagreb-Karlovac-Gracac-Knin or the highway Zagreb-Split.



About Split

Split is a town-palace in the very meaning of the word. Lovers of cultural and historical monuments, art, original architecture and nice alleys are given the opportunity in Split to learn about the manifold and complex heritage. Everything started here before 1.700 years when the Roman Emperor Diocletian built here his own palace for old days, later from the 7th century, people came here from Antic Salona live and transform the palace as a town. Now in Split, you will find a fantastic places with constructions from Antic, Romanic, Gothic and Renaissance period. People who lived there bring with them traditions, culture and knowledge from the most powerful empire through the history: Rome, Byzantium, Venice, Austro-Hungary etc. Today, Split is the second town in Croatia and for sure the heart of Dalmatia, with his International airport and his ferry harbor from where You will easily join all the famous Dalmatian Islands: Hvar, Brač, Šolta, Korčula, Vis etc. You will find also a very interesting and rich green market.
